Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park is a protected area in the Northern Territory of Australia. The park is home to both Uluru and Kata Tjuta. Uluru, also known as Ayers Rock, is a large sandstone rock formation that is sacred to the Pitjantjatjara Anangu, the Aboriginal people of the area. The area around the formation is home to an abundance of springs, waterholes, rock caves and ancient paintings. Uluru is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Kata Tjuta, also known as the Olgas, is a group of large, domed rock formations. The 36 domes that make up Kata Tjuta cover an area of 8.37 sq mi, and are composed of conglomerate, a sedimentary rock consisting of cobbles and boulders of varying rock types. The highest dome, Mount Olga, is 1,066 m (3,497 ft) above sea level.

Australia Zoo is located in the Australian state of Queensland on the Sunshine Coast. The zoo was made famous by Steve Irwin, whose wildlife documentary series *The Crocodile Hunter* made the zoo a popular tourist attraction.

Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary was founded in 1927, and is the world's oldest and largest koala sanctuary. The Brisbane Koala Science Institute, located at Lone Pine, opened in 2018 and will be working towards real, practical outcomes for local koala populations.
